

Open Call for Artworks EOI

The University of Alberta is inviting artists to share their work at the SUPPORT Festival in Edmonton, Alberta (and online) in 2028.

This festival is hosted by the Smartwear Revolution, a major research project making everyday clothes with built-in technology to help people move, balance, and feel supported.

What is the festival about?

The festival will explore what support means—physically, emotionally, socially, and through technology.

Artworks can focus on topics like:

- Care and caregiving
- Technology and the body
- Accessibility and disability
- The future of clothing that helps people move

Who can apply?

Anyone can apply—locally or internationally. We welcome:

- Artists, designers, performers, students, and creative groups
- Artists of all abilities and backgrounds

We especially encourage applications from people with personal or work experience with disability, chronic illness, aging, caregiving, or healthcare.

What kind of work can you submit?

You can propose:

- New art made for this festival
- Existing art that fits the theme
- Fresh or unexpected ideas

Formats can include visual art, live performance, fashion, installations, digital media, research projects, or online presentations.

Pay and Artist Fees

- Stage 2 shortlist: You will receive a paid fee (honorarium) to write a full proposal.
- Chosen artists: You will be paid standard professional artist fees (CARFAC, CADA, or CAEA rates). Some projects will also get extra funding to help cover production costs.

Important Dates

- First application (EOI) due: December 15, 2026
- Stage 1 results shared: January 15, 2027
- Full proposals due (shortlisted artists): February 15, 2027
- Final artists announced: March 15, 2027
